UNDERSTANDING OVERALL PERFORMANCE

This report card is designed to tell us how well we are helping students reach grade level and how well we are preparing them for success after high school. Much like the grades we give students, we can use these grades to identify ways to help schools improve over time. The overall grade is based on performance in three different areas, or domains, which are noted below.



STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT: *How well did students do academically this year?*

Student Achievement measures whether students have met grade-level expectations as measured by the STAAR test. It also considers graduation rates and how prepared students are for life after high school.

SCHOOL PROGRESS: *How much better did the students perform at this school or district?*

School Progress measures how much better students performed on the STAAR test this year versus last year. It also looks at how much better students are doing academically at the district compared to similar districts.

- What percentage of students made a year's worth of academic growth in reading and math?
- How much progress are students making relative to students at similar schools or districts?



CLOSING THE GAPS: *How well are different groups of students performing?*

Closing the Gaps measures the percentage of different groups of students that are performing above state goals in four areas.
